It is the responsibility of the corresponding author to check with the institution affiliated to their submission that MIDIRS Midwifery Digest is a suitable digest for publication of their submission prior to submission. Articles published in MIDIRS Midwifery Digest can be shared as per the [Terms and Conditions](#).

\*TA institutional arrangements allow authors to publish Open Access (OA) in applicable journals without paying Article Processing Charges (APCs), provided their institution or country is part of a Transformative Agreement with the applicable publisher.

Transformative Agreements are formal contracts between academic institutions—such as universities, national consortia, or research funders—and publishers. They restructure the traditional subscription model by shifting financial investment from paywalled access to open publishing. In practice, eligible authors can publish their research OA at no direct cost, while maintaining full access to journal content through institutional subscriptions. These agreements align with major global initiatives, such as Plan S [2,3], which mandates that publicly funded research be made openly and immediately accessible.
